# Grading

Grades will be computed on a weighted basis and each assignment will be given point values. A variety of assignments and assessments are listed, but not limited to the following: lecture, homework, projects, in class activities, labs, research papers, power point presentations, quizzes, and tests. Grades will be calculated every 5 weeks where a progress report or report card will be issued by the school. Appropriate interventions will be provided for any student still working toward mastery of the state standards.

<u>Homework</u>: given every day due in the front basket before the bell rings. Homework is to give the student practice and aid in studying for the upcoming tests

**Tests:** given ever 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> class meeting

**Labs:** 8 labs are completed during this semester and each are worth 100 points. Graded as follows

- D = incomplete lab
- C = doing the minimum of the lab and answer all questions correctly.
- B- = complete the laboratory in class answering all questions correctly, neatly drawing and labeling all graphs and images.
- A = doing the above + typing a hypothesis, purpose, materials, Analysis or Error and conclusion

## Make up work -

- It is the student's responsibility to get the make up work the day he or she returns to school.
  - O Students should get the make up work during tutorial or brunch (not during class)
- They will have one day per every class they where absent to make up the work
- Write the date and the word absent large on the top of the page.
- 4 free late work passes can be used through out the semester

## Make up tests and labs

- To be done before school (or by appointment) within two days upon returning to school
- The make up test will be a different version of the original class test.

The student will be <u>dropped from the National Honors Society</u> (NHS) and <u>California Scholarship Federation</u> (CSF) if the student is a member of that organization.

### The following consequences may be enacted if a violation occurs:

The student may be <u>removed from the class for one day</u>, serve a four hour <u>Saturday School</u> and the student may face <u>suspension from extra-curricular activities</u>, <u>including sports</u>
